The listing is in the conventional order of the Egyptian phonetic alphabet as followed by Jonckheere and Ghalioungui.

There are no inflexible rules for anglicisation of proper names and, in many cases, alternative forms are in common use. Hyphenation has been used to simplify pronunciation, but also indicates the division between Egyptian words in the names.
